SUBJECT: PUBLIC DISCLOSURE DETERMINATION

Dear Mr. Thompson:

By letter dated August 24, 2000, NAC International, Inc. (NAC) submitted supplemental responses to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) request for additional information (RAI-2) to support its application for an amendment to the certificate of compliance for the Model No. NAC-UMS Universal Storage System. Enclosed with the August 24, 2000, submittal was NAC's calculation package, "Thermal Analyses for UMS Transfer Cask/Canister for PWR Fuel with Reduced Heat Loads," Calculation EA790-3206, Revision 0." An electronic copy of NAC's non-proprietary submittal can be found in the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) under ADAMS Accession No. ML003747733.

With the letter, NAC submitted an affidavit signed by Charles W. Pennington dated August 24, 2000. In the affidavit, Mr. Pennington states that the above calculation should be withheld from public disclosure, pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790 of the Commission's regulations, for the following reasons:

- (a) The information has been held in confidence and is the result of design calculations, component design details, and critical dimensions that were developed by NAC. The information is customarily held in confidence by NAC based on the significant commercial investment expended in its development;
- (b) The information is not available in public sources, and NAC is transmitting it to the NRC in confidence; and
- (c) The public disclosure of the information would cause substantial harm to the competitive position of NAC. Competitors seeking to develop similar analysis would have to expend similar amounts of time, engineering labor, and money in its development.

On the basis of your submittal, our review of the above listed documents, and in light of the requirements of 10 CFR 2.790, we have determined that the information designated as proprietary should be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790.

It is the policy of the NRC to achieve an effective balance between legitimate concerns for protection of competitive positions and the right of the public to be fully apprised as to the basis for and effects of licensing and rulemaking actions. Withholding from public disclosure shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public disclosure should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. Please be advised that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your withheld information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
