Dear Governor Easley:

In 1976, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) adopted a recommendation from several State organizations, including the National Governors' Association, that we request each State to appoint a single person to act as liaison to NRC for the purpose of improving Federal/State cooperation. The NRC looks to the Governor-appointed State Liaison Officers to provide a communication channel between the States and the NRC, to be the key person in the State to keep the Governor completely informed on nuclear regulatory and related public health and safety matters, and to provide NRC with answers to questions posed to the States on particular issues.

Former Governor Hunt appointed Richard M. Fry, Director, Division of Radiation Protection in the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, as North Carolina's State Liaison Officer. The NRC will continue to work with Mr. Fry, and, unless you choose a new State Liaison Officer, we will keep you informed of our programs and activities through Mr. Fry. At the same time, we will maintain our ties with various individuals in State agencies with whom we have established relationships for specific issues.

The Commission looks forward to the continued participation by the State of North Carolina in the NRC State Liaison Officer program.
