Dear Governor Hodges:

In 1976, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) adopted a recommendation from several State organizations, including the National Governors' Association, that we request each State to appoint a single person to act as liaison to NRC for the purpose of improving Federal/State cooperation. The NRC looks to the Governor-appointed State Liaison Officers to provide a communication channel between the States and the NRC, to be the key person in the State to keep the Governor completely informed on nuclear regulatory and related public health and safety matters, and to provide NRC with answers to questions posed to the States on particular issues.

It is my understanding that the most recent State Liaison Officer, who was the Director of the Division of Radioactive Waste Management in the Department of Health and Environmental Control, has retired. The NRC will continue to work with Mr. Henry Porter, within the Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Land and Waste Management, who is temporarily performing the function of State Liaison Officer. Unless you choose a new State Liaison Officer, we will keep you informed of our programs and activities through Mr. Porter and the Bureau Chief, Mr. Hartsill W. Truesdale. At the same time, we will continue to work with various individuals in State agencies with whom we have established relationships on specific issues.

The Commission looks forward to the continued participation by the State of South Carolina in the NRC's State Liaison Officer program.
