I don't understand Gov. Leavitt position on nuclear waste coming into Utah. First he had a road in the west desert identified to keep nuclear waste from being moved to the Goshute Indian Res. Yet on May 21, 1998, (as reported by the Ogden Standard) he had six unnamed Utah State Legislator given full disclosure by National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory regarding the shipping of low-level waste through Northern Utah to begin in June of this year. I believe that the public should know who those six legislators are, and if there is some secret conspiracy in the shipping of low-level radioactive materials to Carlsbad, N.M. These shipment are using interstate 80 and 15," while this route is much further", because Carlsbad is in the most southern and most eastern areas of New Mexico. The road of U.S. # 30 into Wyoming, and interstate 25 is a more direct route with less traffic, and fewer in population. Both routes are governed by the same federal highway laws.

So if there is no chance of damage in the movement of these materials, and they have qualified drivers, there should be no problem in the use of my suggested route. It would give some peace of mind to the people of northern Utah.
