The United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission, with the United States Department of the Interior's Bureaus of Indian Affairs, and Land Management Will Hold Two Scoping Meetings April 29, 1999 on Aspects of the Environmental Impact Statement For The Proposed Private Fuel Storage Facility
