Dear Mr. Chairman:

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has sent to the Office of the Federal Register the enclosed *Federal Register* notice for publication in which the NRC denies a petition for rulemaking. In the petition for rulemaking dated July 13, 1999, the petitioner (Nuclear Energy Institute) requested that the Commission amend its regulations to delete the requirement, found in 10 CFR §51.53(c)(3)(ii)(L), to consider Severe Accident Mitigation Alternatives (SAMAs) as part of the environmental review to support license renewal decisions. The Commission is denying the petition because the agency must continue to consider SAMAs for issuance of a new or renewed operating license for a power reactor in order to meet its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), notwithstanding the legal arguments presented in the petition. However, the Commission will work with stakeholders to identify ways to gain efficiencies in addressing SAMAs, while continuing to fulfill its obligations under NEPA.
