Sinclair Research Laboratories, Inc. will open a new high level radiation facility at its Harvey, Illinois Research Center on April 9, 1957. At that time, we plan to have a short dedication ceremony and an inspection of the facility.

You and your staff were most helpful in providing information and expediting license arrangements needed for this facility. We extend to you, and to other members of your staff whom you wish to select, a most cordial invitation to participate in this dedication ceremony.

We believe that the completion of our laboratory represents a small milestone in the progress of the atomic energy program, since we will be the first private industrial laboratory using waste fission products in the form of used fuel elements as a radiation source.
