Comments: I just found out about this draft report and probably the comment period is over, but, nonetheless, I have a few short comments that pertain to any nuclear waste.
"On December 27, 1979, EPA listed radionuclides as a hazardous air pollutant under section 112 of the CAA (44FR 76738, Dec. 27, 1979). EPA determined that radionuclides are a known cause of cancer and genetic damage and that radionuclides cause or contribute to air pollution that may reasonably be anticipated to result in an increase in mortality or an increase in serious irreversible or incapacitating reversible illness, and therefore constitute a hazardous air pollutant within the meaning of section 112(a)(1)." "It is assumed that there is no completely risk-free level of exposure to radiation to cause cancer." As there is no benefit to having radionuclides in our air, water or soil, there is no reason to consider putting there. Why would you even consider it? Your job is to protect the public health, not compromise it. You should be lowering the amount of radioactive exposure. All it takes is common sense, folks. If only it could be canned, I'd buy you all some.
