Comments: Both Indian Point plants have been managed with the main priority cost saving, at the expense of safety. There is certainly no guarantee that Entergy will be any better. The economics of the situation dictate otherwise. According to the Health Department, radioactivity in the Hudson River near these plants is rising- far above background radiation levels. Also, as per the HealthDept. cancer levels have also been rising in all the counties reached by wind from these plants. There is cancer in the Tomcod fish. They annually kill millions of fishlarva and eggs through entrainment. More importantly, the health effects are still being studied, but it looks as if radiation may play a significant part in cancer incidence, infant mortality, and Downe Syndrome. Both plants are nearing the limit of their natural age, with multiple "incidents" in which staff lack OF TRAINING, cover up, use of faulty equipment, and profit making as first priority.
