Subject: LICENSING OF COBALT 60 BOURCE

Dear Mr. Murphy:

We have been advised by Mr. H. B. Kearney, Sales Manager, Canadian Radium and Uranium Corporation that they had disposed of a Cobalt 60 source naming Nuclear Development Corporation as the recipient. At the time the authorization was issued to Canadian Radium and Uranium Corporation in 1950 it provided for 500 millicuries of Cobalt 60.

In Mr. Kearney's letter he indicated that you procured this source under Atomic Energy Commission Authorization No. 32579. This authorization was issued for the purpose of permitting you to obtain 15 curies of mixed fission products and has now expired. It does not provide for the procurement of radioactive cobalt. It will be necessary that you apply to the Commission for a license to <u>provide</u> for the continued possession of this byproduct material.

We are enclosing Form AEC-313, "Application for Byproduct Material License." You should estimate the activity present in the source at the time of purchase in Item 8 of the application and in Item 11 state the purpose for which it will be used. We are routinely requiring that sources be tagged when handled in open air. The tag should be at least one inch square except for thickness and should bear at least the following instruction: "Danger - Radioactive Material - Do Not Handle - Notify Civil Authorities if Found," and a conventional radiation symbol.

Your cooperation in furnishing us with the above information will be appreciated.

In the understanding from your letter referred to that we had authority to deliver the Cobalt 60 to person or persons licensed to receive it, we delivered the Cobalt 60 in its original container to a Mr. Miles representing the Nuclear Development Corporation of America, 5 New Street, White Plains, New York. At the time of delivery, Mr. Miles presented at our Refinery U. S. Atomic Energy Commission Byproduct Material License No. 31-350-2 which, however, seems to cover only Polonium 210. Subsequent to delivery, we asked the Nuclear Development Corporation for something more specific as to their right to receive the material and we now enclose to you a letter under date of March 12th in behalf of the Nuclear Development Corporation by Mr. Peter C. Murphy, Security Officer. As you will see from Mr. Murphy's letter, the Cobalt 60 is to be used under their Atomic Energy Commission license 32579.
