SUBJECT: UPDATE OF PROGRESS ON ORPHAN SOURCE ISSUES AND
PILOT PROGRAM (FOLLOW-UP TO SECY-00-0184)

This memorandum provides an update of progress on orphan source issues, previously discussed in SECY-00-0184, "Staff Progress on Orphan Source Issues: Follow-up to SECY-99-038," dated August 24, 2000.

Since August 2000, the Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors (CRCPD) E-34 Committee on Unwanted Radioactive Material (the E-34 Committee) has made considerable progress on its orphan source pilot program, and the development of a national orphan source program. The E-34 Committee has: 1) established a contract with the Colorado State Radiation Control Program to execute a pilot program to retrieve and dispose of approximately 30 cesium-137 orphan sources; 2) established a very aggressive schedule in November 2000, for the completion of its program development activities and the pilot; and 3) gained approval from the CRCPD Board of Directors to expand the pilot to include orphan source recoveries in the States of New York, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. The E-34 Committee expects to arrange for retrieval of all sources in Colorado by March 31, 2001, and issue a final report on its development of a national orphan source program by mid-April 2001.

Resolution of potential liability issues has been the biggest challenge in executing the pilot program contracts. The E-34 Committee wants to assure the capability to respond promptly to orphan source incidents. To establish a process that is more streamlined, while minimizing potential contractual and liability issues, the committee is applying lessons learned from the initial pilot in Colorado to its approach to the specific orphan source cases in the other three States. The committee will also consider the lessons learned from the cases in the other three States in its final report on the development of a national orphan source program.
