SUBJECT: INDIAN POINT NUCLEAR GENERATING UNIT NO. 2 (IP2) - REQUEST FOR
WITHHOLDING INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

Dear Mr. Blind:

By letter dated February 2, 2001, Consolidated Edison Company of New York (ConEd) provided additional information concerning the public meeting held January 24, 2001, regarding a petition requesting emergency enforcement action against Indian Point 2 filed under Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Section 2.206. In the letter, ConEd requested that certain privacy information (e.g., names, telephone numbers) contained within condition reports turned over to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) during that public meeting by the petitioners be withheld from public disclosure. On February 28, 2001, ConEd provided the NRC with a redacted version of the conditions reports which could be released to the public. The redacted condition reports have been placed in the NRC public document room and added to the Agencywide Documents Access and Management Systems Publicly Available Records System (ADAMS PARS) Library.

We have reviewed ConEd's request based on the requirements of 10 CFR 2.790 and have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains personal privacy information. Therefore, the privacy information so identified by ConEd will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(a)(6) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

You should understand that withholding information from public disclosure shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of the information to our consultants working in this area.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all such review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
