We have reviewed the final Kentucky Administrative Regulations (KAR) amendments (effective February 2, 2001), which were provided to us for initial review via e-mail on January 19, 2001. The final regulations are in response to the 3 amendments identified in the enclosed State Regulation Status. The regulations were reviewed by comparison to the equivalent NRC regulations in 10 CFR Parts 30, 34, 71 and 150. We understand that the proposed regulations were not sent for comment prior to their adoption as final regulations. We discussed our review of the regulations with you on February 16, 2001.

As a result of the NRC review, we have identified one comment, as enclosed. This comment must be addressed to meet the compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) Procedure SA-200.

The State Regulation Status summarizes our knowledge of other Kentucky regulations. Please let us know if you note any inaccuracies or have any comments on the information contained in the status. COMMENTS ON FINAL KENTUCKY REGULATIONS AGAINST COMPATIBILITY AND HEALTH AND SAFETY CATEGORIES

Section 22 Subsection (2)	34.49(b)	1997-5	C	Radiation Surveys and Survey Records The Kentucky regulation combines two sentences from 10 CFR 34.49(b) resulting in a change of emphasis when performing surveys. The NRC regulation requires a survey whenever the device or guide tube is approached. The result of the survey is to determine that the sealed source is in its shielded position before taking any further action. In contrast, the Kentucky regulation requires a survey if these items are approached to determine that the source was returned to its shielded position. We recommend that your one sentence be split into two sentences, as in the NRC regulation, or as proposed in the Suggested State Regulation, Section E21.b, to read as follows to meet the compatibility category: A survey with a radiation survey instrument shall be made after a radiographic exposure, of the radiographic exposure device and the guide tube, if approaching the device or guide tube. The result must determine that the sealed source has been returned to its shielded position before exchanging films, repositioning the exposure head, or dismantling equipment.
