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Dear Mr. Mangan:

Low Power License No. NPF-54 for Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, Unit 2 contains two license conditions as follows:

1. Inservice Testing of Pumps and Valves (Section 3.9.6, SER, SSER No. 3)

Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55a(g)(6)(i) and for the reasons set forth in Section 3.9.6 of SSER No. 3, the relief identified in the Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation submittal dated November 27, 1985, requesting relief from certain pump and valve testing requirements of the 1980 Edition of ASME Code Section XI through Winter 1980 Addenda is granted until October 31, 1988, or until a detailed review of the inservice testing program for pumps and valves, has been completed, whichever comes first.

2. Inservice Inspection (Sections 5.2.4.3 and 6.6.3, SSER 5)

Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55(a)(3) and for the reasons set forth in Sections 5.2.4.3 and 6.6.3 of SSER No. 5, the relief identified in the Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation's submittal dated October 15, 1985, as revised by submittals dated January 24, May 9, and July 9, 1986, requesting relief from certain requirements of 10 CFR 50.55a(g) for the preservice inspection program, is granted.

Although these reliefs are in the low power license, we do not plan to include them in the full power license. We do, however, consider the grants of relief to still be in effect and provide this letter as documentation of that fact. We are retaining the provision in the license that requires you to submit an inservice inspection program by July 31, 1987.
