<b>Subject:</b> Scrap Metal from former J & L/LTV Site sets off Radiation Monitor Alarms at Koppel Steel		
<p><b>Summary:</b> Mr. Mancini contacted the NRC on April 10, 2001, to report the following event:</p> <p>J &amp; L/LTV owned a property in Aliquippa from 1902 to 1989. Bet Tech purchased it in 1993. Beaver Valley Slag is a Salvage Co. that was salvaging slag at the J &amp; L/LTV property. A load of the scrap that was gathered during the salvage operation set the rad monitors when it arrived on April 9, 2001, at Koppel Steel in Koppel, PA. The load of scrap was rejected and returned to Aliquippa.</p> <p>Jim Yusko provided the following information: Steve Bostjancic of PADEP responded and performed surveys of the rejected material. He found refractory items such as lance nozzles (used in the steel-making process). PADEP concluded that these were NORM-contaminated items and that they were contaminated at low levels. PADEP informed Beaver Valley Slag of their findings.</p>
