PURPOSE: The NRC staff is developing an improved schedule model for the review of license renewal applications based on the experience gained from the first applications. The model will reflect the current process being used for reviewing renewal applications and will provide the flexibility needed to adjust interim milestones to accommodate the high level of work expected resulting from receipt of five applications in 2001 within approximately one month of each other. This meeting begins discussions with the three applicants planning 2001 renewal submittals to develop an integrated schedule using the new model.

VEPCO plans on submitting concurrent renewal applications for its Surry and North Anna Nuclear Stations in late May 2001. Duke plans submittal of concurrent renewal applications for its McGuire and Catawba Nuclear Stations in June 2001. Exelon plans submittal of a renewal application for its Peach Bottom Atomic Power Station in July 2001.
