SUBJECT: STOLEN RADIOGRAPHY CAMERA

DESCRIPTION: On May 10, 2001, the Texas Bureau of Radiation Control (TBRC) notified NRC's Operations Center of a stolen radiography camera. The TBRC was informed on May 10, 2001, by Technical Welding Laboratory, a Texas licensee, that a SPEC 150 Camera #23 containing a 1.48 megabequerel (40 curies) iridium-192 source (Serial No. KB 0109) had been stolen. The licensee informed the TBRC that a truck and the camera were stolen in Pasadena, Texas. The truck was found by the local police; however, the camera was missing from the truck. The licensee plans to make a press release. The TBRC is continuing to work with the licensee and local authorities to locate the camera. The TBRC has not requested assistance from the NRC at this time.

NRC Operations Center received notification of this occurrence from TBRC at 5:30 p.m. (EDT) on May 10, 2001. Region IV has informed OEDO, IAT, NMSS, OSTP, and Region IV's SLO and PAO. The IAT notified the FBI headquarters and Region IV is notifying the local FBI office.

This information has been discussed with the State and is current as of 9:30 a.m. (CDT) on May 11, 2001.
