Response To Regulatory Issue Summary 2001-08
Docket Nos. 50-255, 50-263, 50-266, 50-282, 50-301, 50-305, 50-306, and 50-331

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission, in Regulatory Issue Summary 2001-08 dated April 2, 2001, requested licensees to voluntarily provide a numerical estimate of the number of licensing actions projected for submittal during Fiscal Years (FY) 2001 and 2002. In addition, a brief summary of those actions likely to require complex reviews was requested. The following represents the number of licensing actions expected to be submitted for the remainder of FY 2001 (ending September 30, 2001) and for FY 2002.

- Palisades - Conversion to risk-informed inservice inspection (ISI) plan
- Monticello - Conversion to risk-informed ISI (August, 2001)
- Prairie Island - No complex submittals planned

Summary of Anticipated FY2002 Licensing Actions Requiring Complex Reviews

- Duane Arnold - Dry cask storage
- Conversion to risk-informed ISI (January 2002).
- Kewaunee - Power uprate
- Conversion to risk-informed ISI (September 2002)
- Point Beach - Power uprate
- License Renewal
- Conversion to risk-informed ISI (November 2001)
- Reactor Vessel Master Curve Technology
- Palisades - No complex submittals planned
- Monticello - Conversion to 24-month operating cycle
- Prairie Island - Conversion to risk-informed ISI (May 2002)
