1 - 2	MR. CLAXTON: For the record, today is Wednesday,
3	May 12th, 1999. This is an interview of Walter Lewellyn.
4	This interview is being conducted at the Watts Bar Nuclear
5	Plant at 1260 Nuclear Plant Road in Spring City, Tennessee.
6	Also present at the interview is Ed Bigluicci who
7	is corporate counsel for Tennessee Valley Authority, and
8	myself, I am Gary Claxton, Special Agent, Office of
9	Investigations, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
10	MR. CLAXTON: Mr. Lewellyn, we talked earlier
11	about Mr. Bigluicci being here. Is he here at your request?
12	MR. LEWELLYN: Yes.
13	MR. CLAXTON: Okay. And you understand that he is
14	an attorney for the Tennessee Valley Authority.
15	MR. LEWELLYN: Yes.
16	MR. CLAXTON: And that he can share anything he
17	hears with the TVA?

10	DIRECT EXAMINATION	
11	BY MR. CLAXTON:	
12	Q What is your full name?	
13	A William Walter Lewellyn.	
14	Q Okay. Would you spell your last name, please?	
15	A L-e-w-e-l-l-y-n.	
16	Q And where do you reside Mr. Lewellyn?

Q Can you give me a little bit of background as to what you did here, if you could just work backwards and how long you have been gone from TVA?

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A I retired in November 1996, employed in the nuclear licensing and compliance in 1990. And prior to that I was a supervisor in civil engineering for around 10 years, and prior to that I was a mechanical engineer for TVA approximately 10 years experience.

So total time employed with TVA was --

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A Twenty-six years.

12 Q Twenty-six years. And from 1990 to 1996 you were 13 in compliance?

A Yes.

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O Okay. And what were your responsibilities there?

A Liaison officer for 22 years in licensing -- in
NRC, response to violations, 55(e), various compliance
responsibilities.

19 Q Also, before the interview we talked about a 20 meeting that occurred on June 14th, 1995 and what led up to 21 that meeting. I have shown you a sign-in list that you 22 acknowledge that your name is on there. Do you recall 23 anything about that meeting or the purpose of the meeting?

A It had to do with the ice condensers and some problems that were identified with the ice condensers, and I

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vaguely remember the screws as being part of the issue. Ι 1 think some of them had fallen out. That's about it. 2 Do you recall who moderated the meeting or who was 0 З responsible for calling the meeting?z 4 Α No. 5 Do you recall how you learned of the meeting or Ο 6 why -- what your purpose was in being there? 7 Well, it was through my management, and I guess I Α 8 was assigned to that as a liaison in covering the issue. 9 Do you remember any more specifically what the Q 10 issue involved? 11 No. А 12 Other than ice screws, ice baskets? 13 0 I remember there was more than one issue with the 14 А ice condensers, something to do with the doors at the 15 bottom, and I think it was having difficulty in closing the 16 doors, or something. There was more than one issue with the 17 ice condensers. 18 Do you recall whether or not someone brought some, 0 19 for what of a better word, some props to the meeting, some 20 screws and ice basket collars? 21 I think I do, yes, vaguely. 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No, I don't recall that. That is part of the Α specifics I don't recall.

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As best as you can --

I will volunteer. Yes, as best as I can remember Α it was just an informative meeting, you know, to do some looking into what the problem was, best I can remember.

Did you ever see the reports dated June 2nd or 0 June 19th regarding the ice basket screws that were produced by the Central Labs?

I am sure I did, but I can't remember any of the 11 А I think those -- there was reports there, at specifics. 12 least one report and I don't remember the specifics of those 13 reports. 14

And as I ask you these questions, it is not like 0 15 you are supposed to remember the information, but if I don't 16 ask you, I don't know. Do you recall whether you read that 17 report before or after the meeting? 18

No, I don't -- I am thinking that that report was А available during the meeting. But I can't say for sure, I 20 don't think it was after the meeting. I think it was at 21 least during the report that I was exposed to the report. 22

Do you recall whether you discussed the ice basket 0 23 screw issue with Terry Woods or Jim Adair? 24

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I don't think I discussed it, I think I was more

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of an observer. I remember taking notes, but I do not have		
those notes.		
Q Did you typically carry a personal notebook to		
meetings like that?		
A Yes. Yes.		
Q Okay. And have you checked to see if you have		
those notes?		
A Yes. I did not keep any.		
Q Okay. Did you have any involvement in the ice		
basket screws after the meeting of June 14th that you		
recall?		
A I don't remember, I don't remember what		
involvement I had. I do not remember that.		
Q If I understand what you are telling me, you		
acknowledge that you were at the meeting on June 14th as one		
of probably many meetings you were attending routinely?		
A Yes.		
Q Well, you know, let me I don't want to invent		
the word.		
A Right.		
Q But did you consider this a routine meeting		
A Yes.		
Q where you represented compliance and licensing		
group?		
A Uh-huh. Yes, it was just a routine meeting,		
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F L informative type meeting is what I remember.

MR. CLAXTON: I don't think I have any other questions. Ed, do you have anything?

MR. BIGLUICCI: No, I don't have any other question.

BY MR. CLAXTON:

Q Do you have any questions, any additional information about what we have talked about?

The only thing that I can remember is that we did Α 9 discuss the problems of the screws and the failures of the 10 screws, and I do remember that one of the possibilities was 11 -- I do remember thermal cycling possibility as to why the 12 screws failed. I definitely remember that. And it really 13 made some sense to me, but I didn't have any input one way 14 or the other to that. I was observing. That is the only 15 thing that I do remember, was that that was a possible cause 16 17 of the screws failing.

18 Q Do you recall whether anything was said about a 19 subsequent report due to be issued?

A I hope you are not putting words -- I hope you are not -- you know, sometimes people can imagine things, you know. I hope I am not doing that, but I think I do remember about a subsequent report to be issued, but other than that, that's as far as I can go.

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Did you have any reason to read that second

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report?

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I can't remember. I really, really can't А remember. I do vaguely remember there probably was a second report, but this is speculation on my part, really. I can't go any further.

I think I asked you earlier if you had any 0 involvement in the ice basket screws, and I think I recall you saying that you did not have any further involvement.

No, not that I know of. It is very cloudy. Ι Α will just be honest with you, it is very cloudy. 10

That happens after four years, doesn't it? 0 Yeah, a lot of other things. Α

I understand. All right. Do you have anything 0 else that you recall?

Α. No.

Or just anything come to mind as we talk about 16 0 17 that meeting?

A NO.

MR. CLAXTON: Okay. Well, if you have no further questions, we will conclude the interview at 11:00 a.m. THE INTERVIEWEE: Okay.
