In response to your E-Mail of May 20, 2001, I've reviewed the involvement of Brown & Root in the construction of the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station (CPSES) as reflected in the NRC's "Safety Evaluation Report Related to the Operation of Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station, Units 1 and 2". NUREG-0797. During construction of CPSES, problems with work performed by Brown & Root were identified. As an example, quality assurance problems were found with cable trays, and associated hardware (hangers), that route safety-related cables. The description of this problem and its resolution is contained in Supplement 15 to NUREG-0797, dated July 1988. As to your statement that Brown & Root might have been "banned from the nuclear industry", we've found no evidence that this was the case.
