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SUBJECT: ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT (TAC# 64403)

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 6 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-49 for Millstone Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 3, in response to your application dated December 5, 1986.

The amendment would revise the Technical Specification Figure 6.2-2, Unit Organization, by changing the depiction of the Millstone Station Services Organization as individual Security, Quality Services and Radiological Services groups reporting to the Station Services Superintendent to depiction as one group of staff including QA, Security, Health Physics, Chemistry and other Site Support Services Staff reporting to the Station Services Superintendent.

A copy of the related Safety Evaluation is also enclosed. The notice of issuance will be included in the Commission's bi-weekly Federal Register notice.



AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 6
License No. DPR-49

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The application for amendment by Northeast Nuclear Energy Company, et al. (the licensee) dated December 5, 1986, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

*Northeast Nuclear Energy Company is authorized to act as agent and representative for the following Owners: Central Maine Power Company, Central Vermont Public Service Corporation, Chicopee Municipal Lighting Plant, City of Burlington, Vermont, Connecticut Municipal Electric Light Company, Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company, Montaup Electric Company, New England Power Company, The Village of Lyndonville Electric Department, Western Massachusetts Electric Company, and Vermont Electric Generation and Transmission Cooperative, Inc., and has exclusive responsibility and control over the physical construction, operation and maintenance of the facility.


2. Accordingly, the license is amended by changes to the Technical Specifications as indicated in the attachment to this license amendment, and paragraph 2.C.(2) of Facility Operating License No. DPR-49 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Technical Specifications

The Technical Specifications contained in Appendix A, as revised through Amendment No. 6, and the Environmental Protection Plan contained in Appendix B, both of which are attached hereto are hereby incorporated in the license. The licensee shall operate the facility in accordance with the Technical Specifications and the Environmental Protection Plan.

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

SAFETY EVALUATION BY THE OFFICE OF NUCLEAR REACTOR REGULATION

1.0 INTRODUCTION

By letter dated December 5, 1986, Northeast Nuclear Energy Company (licensee) requested a change to Section 6 (Figure 6.2-2), Administrative Controls, of the Technical Specifications for Millstone Unit 3. The proposed change would revise the depiction of the Millstone Station Services Organization.

The existing Figure 6.2-2 shows the Security Supervisor, the Quality Service Supervisor and the Radiological Services Supervisor reporting to the Station Services Superintendent. The proposed revision would replace the three supervisor blocks with a single block showing the Station Services Superintendent having responsibility for a number of functional areas with a staff consisting of the QA Supervisor, the Security Supervisor, the Health Physics Supervisor, the Chemistry Supervisor, and other site support services. The licensee states that this change would allow for flexibility in reporting within the Station Services organization and would provide for consistency between the Technical Specifications of Unit 3 with those of Units 1 and 2.

2.0 EVALUATION

Because the Station Services Superintendent still has the same responsibilities as described on the current Figure 6.2-2 and reports at the same organizational level, we see no essential change between the current Figure 6.2-2 and the proposed Figure 6.2-2, except that the new chart is more descriptive of the total responsibilities of the Station Services Superintendent. The proposed change would not result in a decrease in plant controls affecting nuclear safety, and the resultant organization is consistent with the Standard Review Plan, Section 13.1.2. The staff, therefore, finds the proposed change acceptable.

3.0 ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATION

This amendment relates to administrative procedures or requirements. Accordingly, the amendment meets the eligibility criteria for categorical exclusion set forth in 10 CFR 51.22(c)(10). Pursuant to 10 CFR 51.22(b), no environmental impact statement or environmental assessment need be prepared in connection with the issuance of the amendment.

4.0 CONCLUSION

We have concluded, based on the considerations discussed above, that (1) there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by operation in the proposed manner, and (2) such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations, and the issuance of the amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.
