A letter dated June 26, 1975, from Thomas R. Wildman, Esq. of Day, Berry and Howard inquired as to whether the regular reporting requirements of the construction permit issued for the Millstone Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 3 could be discontinued. Specifically, Paragraph 3.H of Construction Permit No. CPPR-113 requires the submission of monthly reports regarding changes and proposed changes in identity of owners and ownership interests and the monthly submittal of job progress reports and invoices.

The June 26, 1975 letter states that all planned transfers have been made except the transfer of ownership interest from the Green Mountain Power Corporation to the New England Power Company. Therefore, Mr. Wildman proposed that reports be submitted only when a change in identity of owners is planned. We have reviewed this proposal and find that although the monthly reports have been useful in monitoring the activities associated with the initial financial changes of the Millstone 3 facility. the suggested change is reasonable at this time since most of the foreseeable changes have been made. Accordingly, we have considered the June 26, 1975 letter as a request for an amendment to Construction Permit No. CPFR-113 and have revised Paragraph 3.E to require reports only when changes are anticipated.

We have concluded that the activities authorized by this amendment ∂/∂ can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public ∂/∂ and that authorization of this amendment to the permit does not involve a significant hazards consideration inasmuch as it involves no significant increase in the probability of an accident, no significant increase in the consequences of an accident, nor does it involve a significant decrease in the safety margin. Therefore, we have concluded that an amendment to the permit to revise the reporting requirements is appropriate.


