Dear Mr. Bowling:

By letter dated February 12, 1998, the Commission issued Amendment No. 157 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-49 for the Millstone Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 3, in response to your application dated August 29, 1997, as supplemented by letters dated September 25 and November 14, 1997.

It has come to our attention that the wording in our Safety Evaluation regarding Technical Specification (TS) Limiting Condition for Operation (LCO) 3.4.9.1 is inaccurate. Specifically, on page 3 of the Safety Evaluation, the staff states:

In the TS, the licensee proposed to further restrict the LCO under "3/4.4.9 Pressure/Temperature Limits" by limiting one pump in operation when the cold leg temperature is less than 160 °F and no pumps in operation when the cold leg temperature is less than 120 °F.

This is a correct statement; however, it only applies to reactor coolant system cooldown (TS 3.4.9.1.b). TS 3.4.9.1.a applies to reactor coolant system heatup and states that only one reactor coolant pump can be operating when the cold leg temperature is less than or equal to 160 °F. We regret any inconvenience this may have caused.
