



Licenses were requested to provide:

- (1) An estimate of the licensing actions expected to be submitted in the remainder of Fiscal Year 2001. (10/1/00 through 9/30/01)

Response: Beaver Valley Power Station expects to submit approximately 6 licensing actions (i.e., License Amendment Requests, etc.) in the remainder of Fiscal Year 2001.

- (2) An estimate of the number of licensing actions expected to be submitted in the Fiscal Year 2002. (10/1/01 through 9/30/02)

Response: Beaver Valley Power Station expects to submit approximately 16 licensing actions (i.e., License Amendment Requests, etc.) in the Fiscal Year 2002.
