SUBJECT: NRC REVIEW OF REPORT OF LOST NRD IN-LINE STATIC ELIMINATOR

Dear Mr. Entwistle:

This refers to your letter dated June 20, 2001, regarding the loss of a nominal 10 millicurie (approximately 6.9 millicurie at time of loss) polonium-210 NRD Model 2021 in-line static eliminator from your W. L. Gore facility in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. We have completed our review and have determined that a violation of 10 CFR 31.5 occurred when the static eliminator was shipped to an unauthorized recipient on September 6, 2000, and ultimately lost.

Although a violation of 10 CFR 31.5 was identified, 3M Company (3M) actions were not willful, 3M identified and reported the violations to the NRC, and took appropriate corrective actions to address the violation and prevent recurrence of similar problems. Therefore, we are exercising enforcement discretion in accordance with the Interim Enforcement Policy for Generally Licensed Devices (May 1, 2000; 65 FR 25368), and not issuing any enforcement action for this violation. However, any future violations of 10 CFR 31.5 may be considered for enforcement action.
