SUBJECT: REQUEST TO UPDATE 1983 CONFIRMATORY ORDER, OCONEE NUCLEAR STATION,  
UNITS 1, 2, AND 3 (TACS 61383, 61384, 61385)

By letter dated November 14, 1985, you requested amendments to Oconee's operating licenses to reflect new implementation schedules for certain NUREG-0737 items based upon their actual implementation or replacement dates which were after the dates specified in the NRC's Confirmatory Order of March 18, 1983. Specifically, you noted that the noble gas stack high range radiation monitors required by NUREG-0737 Item II.F.1(a) had experienced problems with moisture contamination of the cable connectors following initial installation, and you indicated a new schedule to install replacement monitors before or during 1986. Similarly, you noted that NUREG Items II.B.3 (Post-Accident Sampling System) and II.F.1(3) (Reactor Building High Range Radiation Monitors) had already been fully implemented and are operable, although implementation occurred after the date specified by the Order.

The NRC staff has reviewed your request that the Confirmatory Order be revised to reflect the actual implementation dates. Because each of the above items is now installed and currently operable, the proposed change would not serve a purpose commensurate with its associated resource expenditure. Moreover, the record of actual installation is sufficiently reflected by docketed correspondence. Accordingly, we propose to take no further action regarding your request for amendments.

A copy of the Notice of Denial of Amendments, to be published in the Federal Register, is enclosed for your information.

AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has denied a request by Duke Power Company, (licensee) for amendments to Facility Operating License Nos. DPR-38, DPR-47, and DPR-55 issued to the licensee for operation of the Oconee Nuclear Station, Units 1, 2, and 3, located in Oconee County, South Carolina. Notice of Consideration of Issuance of these amendments was published in the FEDERAL REGISTER on June 18, 1986 (51 FR 22235).

The purpose of the licensee's amendment request was to revise a March 18, 1983, Confirmatory Order to reflect new implementation schedules for certain NUREG-0737 items based upon their actual implementation or replacement dates.

The NRC staff has reviewed the request and determined that since each of the items is now installed and currently operable, the proposed change would not serve a purpose commensurate with its associated resource expenditure. Accordingly, the staff concluded that the licensee's request cannot be granted. The licensee was notified of the Commission's denial of the proposed change by letter dated May 5, 1989 .

By *June 12, 1989*, the licensee may demand a hearing with respect to the denial described above. Any person whose interest may be affected by this proceeding may file a written petition for leave to intervene.

A request for hearing or petition for leave to intervene must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission, U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission,




