SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF LICENSE RENEWAL MEETING BETWEEN THE U.S. NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION (NRC) AND THE NEI LICENSE RENEWAL WORKING GROUP; ENTERGY FOR ARKANSAS NUCLEAR ONE, UNIT 1 (ANO-1); SNC FOR HATCH NUCLEAR PLANT (PLANT HATCH), UNITS 1 AND 2; AND FPL FOR TURKEY POINT, UNITS 3 AND 4

A joint meeting was held on June 21, 2001, to discuss generic renewal activities and the status of license renewal applications under review by the NRC. The meeting began with discussions between the NRC's License Renewal Steering Committee (LRSC) and NEI's License Renewal Working Group (WG) on the general status of license renewal applications and generic license renewal activities. The meeting continued with discussions between NRC management and SNC and FPL regarding the reviews of the Hatch and Turkey Point license renewal applications, respectively. The agenda for the meeting is provided as Attachment 1. Attendees at the meeting are listed in Attachment 2. The NRC staff's presentation materials are contained in Attachment 3. The applicants' presentation materials are contained in Attachments 4 and 5. Following is a summary of the discussions at the meeting:

### **NRC LRSC - NEI Working Group**

Before discussing status of applications, the WG commented that to date the license renewal process has been predictable and stable and has worked well. The WG asked if other applicants could expect to receive the same level of effort from the staff. The staff responded that future reviews would be completed in accordance with established schedules as the initial reviews had been. The WG also asked if the appeal process for addressing open items, that the Plant Hatch was currently going through, could be discussed at the next meeting. The staff agreed to add this topic to the next meeting's agenda. The staff provided a summary of the process for public involvement during the preparation of the draft environmental impact statement. The staff added that a communication plan was being developed to better explain this process to the public. FPL suggested for a future meeting a discussion on a new staff activity associated with the environmental review (additional public interaction with staff prior to public meeting on draft environmental impact statement referred to as the "poster session") would be beneficial. The staff clarified that the additional activity associated with the FPL environmental review was initiated to provide members of the public, who had previously expressed concerns with the environmental review process, an opportunity to ask NRC staff questions about the process. The WG asked when lessons learned from past reviews would be shared with applicants and suggested this as a regular topic of discussion for future meetings. The staff agreed to include discussions on lessons learned in future meetings

(discussions on lessons learned have been a past agenda item; therefore, the staff will continue to use it as an agenda item for future meetings).

A. Status of applications

Entergy, SNC, and FPL provided summaries of the ANO-1, Hatch, and Turkey Point license renewal application reviews. The staff provided Entergy a copy of the letter dated June 20, 2001, forwarding the ANO-1 renewed license. As a result of issuing the renewed license, the staff added that the ANO-1 project would be closed within the next few months following formal turnover of the license. Virginia Electric and Power Company stated that they had submitted their applications for the Surry and North Anna Units on May 29, 2001, and were looking forward to working with the staff to finalize the review schedule. Duke Energy stated that they submitted their application for the McGuire and Catawba Units on June 13, 2001, and were planning for upcoming meetings with the staff to provide an orientation on their applications. The Hatch and Turkey Point reviews were subsequently discussed in more detail during the management portion of the meeting (see summaries below). Reviews of all applications are on or ahead of schedule.

B. License renewal interest

Page 1 of Attachment 3 shows the latest information provided to the NRC regarding licensee plans for submitting license renewal applications. The projected submittal date for the remaining 2001 application is July 2 for Peach Bottom.

The staff asked if there were any changes to the schedules reflected in Page 1. A representative from the Cooper Station stated that the Cooper application would be deferred by 18 months and a letter would be sent to the NRC reflecting this change within the next month. A representative from Carolina Power and Light Company (CP&L) stated that the H.B. Robinson application was going to be submitted in June 2002 (previously scheduled for October 2002) and its Brunswick application was going to be submitted about six months earlier than currently reflected on Page 1. The CP&L representative also stated that a letter would be sent to the NRC within the next month reflecting the schedule changes.

C. Lessons learned from application reviews

The staff summarized the results from a June 20, 2001, public meeting with the 2001 license renewal applicants to discuss the improved resource model and milestone schedule based on experience gained from past application reviews. The purpose of the meeting was to solicit ideas and suggestions for how review schedules could be integrated to optimize staff loading while considering the applicant's resource constraints. The staff discussed that individual applicant schedules may need to be changed a little to ensure that schedules do not compete, but still ensure that the 25 month review schedule (30 months with a hearing) and 585 day goals were maintained (the 585 day goal is for issuance of the safety evaluation report and environmental impact statement). In addition, the staff needed to ensure that any adjustments would not impact the receipt of the 2002 applications.

(The improved model resulted from lessons learned with the initial renewal reviews and reflects the current process being used for reviewing renewal applications. The improved model was

also developed to provide for adjustment of interim milestones to help level workload resulting from the receipt of the 2001 applications within approximately one month of each other.)

D. License renewal implementation guidance development

Status of improved renewal documents for Commission approval

The staff submitted the guidance documents for Commission approval on April 26, 2001, as shown on Page 2 of Attachment 3. These documents were subsequently made publicly available by the Commission in SECY-01-0074, "Approval to Publish Generic License Renewal Guidance Documents." On June 14, 2001, the staff briefed the Commission on SECY-01-0074. The staff and the industry agree that as more reviews are completed new experience will be gained that should be reflected back into the guidance documents. Therefore, they should be living documents with periodic updates to incorporate ongoing lessons learned.

Demonstration project and continuing dialogue

The staff summarized the status of the demonstration project. NEI submittals of sample license renewal application sections have been received and the staff is in the process of issuing requests for additional information to be sent out the following week (see Pages 2 and 3 of Attachment 3). On May 18, 2001, a letter was sent to NEI to document the staff's understanding on five items associated with the improved guidance documents which NEI requested further dialog on (see Page 2 of Attachment 3). NEI indicated they would be sending a response within the next two weeks and that there might be a few other discussion items in the letter that resulted from not being able to see final resolution on other items until the improved renewal guidance documents were made publicly available. The staff said that new comments would be included with lessons learned from the demonstration project and prioritized for future improvements.

(The industry is conducting a demonstration project with the Generic Aging Lessons Learned Report and Standard Review Plan for the Review of License Renewal Applications for Nuclear Power Plants to use them to prepare and review sample renewal applications.)

License renewal rulemaking recommendation

The Commission directed the staff in its August 27, 1999, staff requirements memorandum for SECY-99-148, "Credit for Existing Programs for License Renewal," to make a recommendation after completing issuance of the guidance documents as to whether it would be appropriate to resolve generic technical issues by rulemaking. The staff's schedule for completing this activity is listed on Page 4 to Attachment 3. A public meeting has been scheduled for June 28, 2001, to solicit the public's feedback on potential rule changes in order to gain additional input to provide a fully informed recommendation to the Commission. A meeting had also been scheduled on July 11, 2001, for the staff to discuss this subject with the Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards.

The WG reiterated its position, as stated in a June 4, 2001, letter from NEI, that no changes in the license renewal rule are needed at this time. The WG stated that the industry understands how to apply the current rule.

The WG commented that it was important to continue the periodic meetings with the NRC LRSC because they help the industry clarify issues to the NRC.

The staff summarized actions for the next meeting to include discussions on appeals process, poster session, and the lessons learned from reviews.

### **NRC Management -- License Renewal Applicants**

#### **Southern Nuclear Operating Company, Inc. -- Hatch**

The staff and SNC noted the accomplishments over the last two months for the review of the Plant Hatch application. The staff and SNC have met or exceeded all scheduling milestones to date for the review of the Plant Hatch application. The staff's presentation materials are contained in Pages 6 and 7 of Attachment 3 and SNC's are in Attachment 4.

The staff noted that since the last management meeting in April, one milestone has been completed. On June 5, 2001, the applicant responded to the staff's open items, ahead of the June 8, 2001 milestone date. In addition, the ACRS issued an interim letter on the Plant Hatch review on April 16, 2001, and the staff issued the final supplemental environmental impact statement on May 31, 2001. A second appeal meeting was held on June 6, 2001, to discuss several open items. SNC noted that they would provide feedback on the appeals process once all open items have been resolved. The staff also noted that its response to SNC's request for a fee waiver is continuing. Upcoming activities and milestones include the resolution of the remaining open items, the final staff inspection (September 7), and issuance of the final safety evaluation report (October 5).

#### **Florida Power and Light Company -- Turkey Point**

The staff presented the status of its review of the Turkey Point application. The staff's presentation materials are contained in Pages 8 and 9 of Attachment 3 and FPL's are in Attachment 5.

The review schedule for the application was discussed. It was noted that the next milestones for the safety review are the staff's issuance of the draft safety evaluation report on August 17, 2001, and the completion of the aging management review inspection on September 14, 2001. No specific technical issues were discussed. The draft supplemental environmental report was issued on June 12, 2001. A public meeting has been scheduled in Homestead, Florida for July 17, 2001. FPL expressed a concern regarding the impact of the staff's plans for the "poster session" preceding the meeting. The staff agreed to arrange a conference call to discuss their concerns and explain the staff's plans for conducting the meeting.

In response to the *Federal Register* offering an opportunity for hearing, two petitions for hearing were received. On January 18, 2001, pursuant to the Commission order CLI-00-23, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board held a prehearing conference in Homestead, Florida, to hear arguments on the standing of one petitioner and the admissibility of the contentions submitted by both petitioners. Subsequently, the Board ruled in an order dated February 26, 2001, that both parties have standing to intervene; however, neither petitioner identified admissible contentions. Therefore, the Board concluded that the intervention petitions were denied and the hearing proceedings terminated. On March 19, 2001, one of the petitioners appealed the ASLB's decision to the Commission. The Commission has not yet acted on this appeal.

The next combined meeting involving the LRSC, WG, NRC staff, and the applicants is planned for September 2001.
