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

SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS January-June 2001

General Information

During the first 6-month period of 2001, the average population granted unescorted access was 1573 individuals. A total of 427 random drug tests were performed, which yielded a random testing rate of 27.1% at the close of the 6-month testing period.

During the 6-month reporting period 1268 samples were collected and tested. Ten of the samples were confirmed positive for illegal substances and the associated 10 individuals were denied access. The testing failure rate (% positive) was 0.79%.

There were no for-cause drug tests performed during the 6-month reporting period.

Seven contract employees provided pre-access urine samples that tested positive for illegal substances and were denied access.

One Entergy and two contract employees tested positive for an illegal substance during the random sampling process and were denied access. The Entergy employee was referred to the EAP and is on a reentry agreement, which includes follow-up testing.

Program Initiatives

Standardization of fitness-for-duty methods and implementation of the revised 10CFR26 requirements for Entergy Nuclear Southwest is ongoing.

Appeals & Retests

During this reporting period no appeals of positive drug confirmations were received. One contractor did request a retest of a urine sample. The retest confirmed the original positive result.

NRC Reportable Events

There were no fitness-for-duty events that met the NRC 24-hour telephonic reporting requirement.

A routine blind specimen certified positive for codeine was sent to NWT laboratories and was incorrectly reported as negative. This incident was reported in accordance with paragraph 2.8(e)(4) of Appendix "A" to 10CFR26 in letter OCAN060102 dated June 20, 2001.
