NOTICE OF PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENTS TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSES

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) is considering the issuance of amendments to Facility Operating Licenses Nos. DPR-32 and DPR-37 issued to Virginia Electric and Power Company (the licensee) for operation of the Surry Power Station Units 1 and 2 pressurized water reactors located in Surry County, Virginia.

The amendments would revise provisions in the Technical Specifications in accordance with the licensee's application for license amendments dated April 15, 1975. The amendments would modify operating limits in the Technical Specifications based upon an evaluation model that conforms to the requirements of the Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Part 50, \$50.46. The amendments would modify various limits established in accordance with the Commission's Interim Acceptance Criteria and Would, with respect to Surry Power Station Units 1 and 2, terminate the further restrictions imposed by the Commission's December 27, 1974 Order for Modification of License and would impose instead limitations established in accordance with the Commission's Acceptance Criteria for Emergency Core Cooling Systems for Light Water Nuclear Power Reactors, 10 CFR Part 50, \$50.46. In addition, the amendments would revise provisions in the Technical Specifications in accordance with the licensee's application for license amendments dated March 12, 1975, related to the replacement of 84 of 157 fuel assemblies in the core of Surry Power Station Unit 2 constituting refueling of the core for second cycle operation.

Prior to issuance of the proposed license amendments, the Commission will have made the findings required by the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations.

the licensee may file a request for a hearing and By any person whose interest may be affected by this proceeding may file a request for a hearing in the form of a petition for leave to intervene with respect to the issuance of the amendments to the subject facility operating licenses. Petitions for leave to intervene must be filed under oath or affirmation in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.714 of 10 CFR Part 2 of the Commission's regulations. A petition for leave to intervene must set forth the interest of the petitioner in the proceeding, how that interest may be affected by the results of the proceeding, and the petitioner's contentions with respect to the proposed licensing action. Such petitions must be filed in accordance with the provisions of this FEDERAL REGISTER notice and Section 2.714 and must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555, Attention: Docketing and Service Section, by the above date. A copy of the petition and/or request for a hearing should be sent to the Executive Legal Director, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory

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Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555, and to Michael W. Maupin, Esquire, Hunton, Williams, Gay and Gibson, Post Office Box 1535, Richmond, Virginia 23213, the attorney for the licensee.

A petition for leave to intervene must be accompanied by a supporting affidavit which identifies the specific aspect or aspects of the proceeding as to which intervention is desired and specifies with particularity the facts on which the petitioner relies as to both his interest and his contentions with regard to each aspect on which intervention is requested. Petitions stating contentions relating only to matters outside the Commission's jurisdiction will be denied.

All petitions will be acted upon by the Commission or licensing board, designated by the Commission, or by the Chairman of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board Panel. Timely petitions will be considered to determine whether a hearing should be noticed or another appropriate order issued regarding the disposition of the petitions.

In the event that a hearing is held and a person is permitted to intervene, he becomes a party to the proceeding and has a right to participate fully in the conduct of the hearing. For example, he may present evidence and examine and cross-examine witnesses.
