Dear Commissioners and Staff:

Pursuant to 10 CFR 26.71(d), PG&E is submitting the enclosed Fitness for Duty (FFD) Performance Report for the period January through June 2001. The performance data has been compiled on the standard forms developed by the Nuclear Energy Institute and is provided in Enclosure 1. As noted in Enclosure 1, individuals being screened for initial unescorted security access (pre-employment testing 60 days prior to being cleared) are tested at lower cut-off levels for marijuana, amphetamines, and two additional substances. This testing is reported under the preaccess category and is conducted in accordance with 10 CFR 26.

Statistical analysis of the data was conducted, and the results are provided in Enclosure 2.

During this period, no significant FFD event reports were made and no licensed operators or supervisors tested positive.

## STATISTICAL ANALYSIS FOR REPORTING PERIOD JANUARY THROUGH JUNE 2001

Analysis of the data indicates that 27.6 percent of the average eligible population was randomly tested during this period.

The random positive rate for all workers at DCPP for the period was 0.62 percent. Licensee employee random positive rate for the period was 0.51 percent. The contractor employee random positive rate during the period was 1.1 percent. PG&E notes that positive results of random testing have increased during this period. As a result, PG&E plans to perform additional data analysis in conjunction with the next FFD program performance report, due in February 2002, for evidence of a continuing trend.

The overall positive test rate for the period was 1.51 percent. Preaccess tests for short-term contractor personnel accounted for 73.1 percent of all positive tests. The large number of positive tests recorded for short-term contractor personnel in the preaccess testing category is attributable to the tenth refueling outage on Unit 2.

During this period, PG&E submitted blind performance specimens in accordance with 10 CFR 26, Appendix A, Section 2.8(e)(2) requirements. There were no reportable events.
