Dear Mr. Wise,


I'm writing to request information under the Freedom of Information Act regarding the radioactive material license (date and licensed for what) that Spencer Chemical Company while performing work for the Department of Energy had with the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission. I also need to know when the site was decommissioned and the destruction of buildings. I would like to know what radioactive material was involved in the making of nuclear weapons, the place on the site where it was made and any documents relating to the personnel who actually performed this work. Also would like some information about radiation exposure levels attained and what workers were exposed to same.

It was quoted in the Joplin Globe that the KDHE has decontaminated the above site for radiation related particles. I would like to know what building on the Spencer Chemical Co. or Gulf Oil Company site was destroyed and documentation of same. I would like to request copies of any and all documents related to the radiation/uranium/ decontamination and findings from this radiation site from past (late 1950's to present.)
