FITNESS FOR DUTY SUMMARY REPORT
January 1, 2001 TO June 30, 2001

SYNOPSIS:

During this reporting period, Nuclear Management Company(NMC)/Duane Arnold Energy Center (DAEC) conducted 831 drug and alcohol tests in accordance with 10 CFR Part 26. There was a refueling outage during this period accounting for significantly higher than usual tests. The break down for this period's testing activity is:

The NMC/DAEC follows the guidelines as provided in 10 CFR Part 26, Appendix A for types of substances and cut-off levels for positive test results. The random testing rate for this period was around 24.02 percent of the average population. There were five instances of individuals submitting specimens for random testing that were determined at time of collection to be low in specific gravity. All five were recollected under observed conditions as soon as was possible. All specimens were packaged separately and sent to the reference lab for testing. None were determined as positive. There were no other instances of "suspicious" specimens collected in this reporting period.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS TAKEN:

For the reporting period ending June 30, 2001, eighteen workers were denied unescorted access after testing positive for drugs or alcohol. By test type two random tests, ten pre-access tests, and six for-cause were positive.

EFFECTIVENESS EVALUATION:

NMC/DAEC continues to implement a Fitness for Duty Program that is effective in achieving the objectives of 10 CFR Part 26.
