SYNOPSIS

This investigation was initiated on August 21, 2000, by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Office of Investigations (OI), Region III, (RIII), to determine if a training instructor was discriminated against in violation of 10 CFR 50.7 at the Byron Nuclear Station (Byron) for raising training concerns.
