SUBJECT: INDIAN POINT NUCLEAR GENERATING UNIT NO. 2 INTERNAL  
DOCUMENTS TO SUPPORT THE DECEMBER 4, 2000, PETITION FOR  
ENFORCEMENT ACTION BY THE CITIZENS AWARENESS NETWORK  
(TAC NO. MB0736)

On December 4, 2000, Citizens Awareness Network (CAN), Public Citizen, Westchester Peoples Action Coalition, Nuclear Information and Resource Service, and Environmental Advocates (Petitioners) filed a Petition pursuant to Section 2.206 of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR 2.206). In June 2001, the Petitioners requested that a second set of Consolidated Edison of New York (ConEd) internal documents that were under consideration in a license transfer proceeding for Indian Point 2 (IP2) be considered as a supplement to the December 4, 2000, Petition. The Petitioners' second set of internal documents consists of a report entitled "ConEd Indian Point II Human Performance Improvement Plan," by the Human Productivity Center, Inc., authored by William Stinnett, Ph.D., a set of condition report summaries from the IP2 condition reporting system, and an evaluation of 19 condition reports by David Lochbaum of the Union of Concerned Scientists.

These documents are accessible electronically in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) through the NRC's Public Electronic Reading Room at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm.html> (ADAMS Accession Nos. ML012910402, ML013240200, and ML012910432, respectively). Due to the sensitive nature of the information in the condition report summaries, some information was redacted. Only the redacted version of the condition report summaries is available to the public. The NRC staff will review these documents against the requirements of Management Directive 8.11, "Review Process for 10 CFR 2.206 Petitions," to determine whether the documents meet the requirements for review pursuant to 10 CFR 2.206. The results of the staff's review will be included in the final Director's Decision for this Petition.
