Dear Chairman Meserve:

I urgently request the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's active participation in the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's reconsideration of the Cove Point liquefied natural gas facility in Maryland.

Last week, I sent you a letter calling your attention to plans to reactivate the Cove Point terminal. I find it alarming that operation of Cove Point, with foreign vessels bringing highlyflammable LNG from Algeria and other countries into the Chesapeake Bay within 3 ½ miles of the Calvert Cliffs nuclear power plant, could increase our vulnerability to terrorism.

Last Friday, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission decided the national security implications of reopening the Cove Point facility merit reconsideration of its October 12 order. Agencies are required to provide comments by this Thursday, November 15. FERC will host a Conference this Friday, November 16, on national security issues raised by reactivation of the Cove Point LNG facility.

The full participation of Nuclear Regulatory Commission is essential to ensure that the vulnerability of the Calvert Cliffs nuclear power plant is fully considered. I know the NRC is taking the terrorist threat to America's reactors seriously.
