SUBJECT: TURKEY POINT UNITS 3 AND 4 - ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENTS RE: EMERGENCY POWER SYSTEM ENHANCEMENT PROJECT (TAC NOS. 69023 AND 69024)

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 138 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-31 and Amendment No. 133 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-41 for the Turkey Point Plant, Units Nos. 3 and 4, respectively. The amendments consist of changes to the Technical Specifications in response to your application transmitted by letter dated July 2, 1990, as supplemented July 3, July 9, July 12, July 23, September 6 and September 28, 1990.

These amendments modify the Technical Specifications to accommodate changes made to the plant as a result of the Emergency Power System Enhancement Project.

A copy of the Safety Evaluation is enclosed. A copy of the Notice of Issuance and Final Determination of No Significant Hazards Consideration is also enclosed. The Notice of Issuance will also be included in the Commission's biweekly Federal Register notice.

## AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 133 License No. DPR-41

- 1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
  - A. The application for amendment by Florida Power and Light Company (the licensee) dated July 2, 1990, as supplemented July 3, July 9, July 12, July 23, September 6 and September 28, 1990, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
  - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
  - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
  - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.
