SUBJECT: TURKEY POINT UNIT 4 - ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT RE: IAEA LICENSE
CONDITION (TAC NO. 75394)

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 130 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-41 for the Turkey Point Plant, Unit No. 4. The amendment consists of a change to the license in response to your application transmitted by letter dated November 17, 1989.

The amendment deletes facility License Condition 3.J relating to the US/International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) safeguards programs. Under this program, Turkey Point Unit 4 was subject to IAEA inspections of nuclear material accounting and nuclear material control.

The termination provisions of License Condition 3.J provide that the IAEA program be terminated as of the date of such notice from the NRC. That notice was provided to you in a letter dated December 2, 1988, and accordingly the IAEA inspection was terminated at that time.

Since the amendment serves only to delete a license condition which is no longer in effect (pursuant to 10 CFR 75.41 and the termination provisions of the license condition itself), this action is administrative. It does not involve significant new safety information of a type not considered by a previous Commission safety review of the facility, nor are IAEA safeguards provisions relied upon in any way for safe operation of the facility. We find the change acceptable.

We have concluded that: (1) there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by operation in the proposed manner, and (2) such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations and the issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

This amendment involves a change to a license pursuant to 10 CFR Parts 50 and 75 relating solely to safeguards matters, and does not involve any construction impacts. The amendment is confined solely to administrative changes. Accordingly, this amendment meets the criteria for categorical exclusion from regulatory actions requiring environmental assessments set forth in 10 CFR 51.22(c)(12). Pursuant to 10 CFR 51.22(b), no environmental impact statement or environmental assessment need be prepared in connection with the issuance of this amendment.

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The application for amendment by Florida Power and Light Company (the licensee) dated November 17, 1989, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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2. Accordingly, the license is amended by deleting paragraph 3.J in its entirety.
3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.
