**Subject:** Quote from Form 526 in the Fee Rule

Mike struck the reference to "60 CFR 18344" in the line you quoted from Form 526 because the reference is nonsensical. It's supposed to be a reference to 60 FR 18344 (April 11, 1995), but the typo makes it look like a reference to the CFR itself.

Because you are quoting, you can always let the error stand. However, Mike thinks it's better to strike it, since it will only confuse anyone who tries to follow the reference. If you delete the reference, you could stick in an ellipsis —

"by the NRC for its licensees in 10 CFR 2.810.... The licensee qualifies as a small entity" *etc*

— to mark the omission.

Alternatively, I think you could correct the typo within the quote by writing "60 [FR] 18344". The square brackets alert the reader to the fact that you are tidying something up. 526 is an NRC form, and I don't see the harm in correcting a printing error in the course of discussing proper use of the form.
