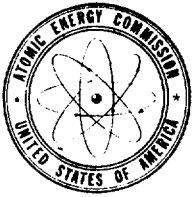

CONSTRUCTION PERMIT

Construction Permit No. CPPR 74
Amendment No. 1

Pursuant to an Initial Decision by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board dated March 1, 1974, the Atomic Energy Commission has issued Amendment No. 1 to Construction Permit No. CPPR-74 by adding a new paragraph 2.D. to read as follows:

- D. This permit is subject to the following conditions for protection of the environment:
- (1) Beach construction activities should be minimized to the greatest extent practicable during the turtle nesting season. If beach construction activities occur during the turtle nesting season, the Applicant will conduct a daily nest location program in affected areas. Nests found will be transferred to another location suitable for hatching and release to the ocean.
 - (2) In restoring the disturbed dune area to its original condition, the Applicant will replant the area at the earliest feasible time with dune stabilizing plants indigenous to the area.
 - (3) The Applicant will install equipment for processing steam generator blowdown with design objectives acceptable to the Regulatory Staff to ensure that discharges of I-131 in the liquid effluents are as low as practicable.

NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO CONSTRUCTION PERMIT

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to an Initial Decision dated March 1, 1974 by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board, the Atomic Energy Commission has issued Amendment No. 1 to Construction Permit No. CPPR-74 issued to the Florida Power and Light Company for construction of the St. Lucie Plant, Unit 1, located in St. Lucie County, Florida. The Board's Initial Decision authorizes the addition of certain conditions to the construction permit for the protection of the environment. These conditions are the same as those recommended by the Regulatory Staff in its Final Environmental Statement for this facility.

The Director of Regulation has found that the provisions of this amendment comply with the requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and the Commission's regulations published in 10 CFR Chapter I and has concluded that the issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

A copy of the Initial Decision dated March 1, 1974, Amendment No. 1 to Construction Permit No. CPPR-74, the Regulatory Staff's Final Environmental Statement, and other related documents are available for

public inspection at the Commission's Public Document Room, 1717 H Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and at the Indian River Junior College Library, 3209 Virginia Avenue, Ft. Pierce, Florida 33450.
