6.0 ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROLS

6.3 UNIT STAFF QUALIFICATIONS

6.3.1 Each member of the unit staff shall meet or exceed the minimum qualifications of ANSI/ANS-3.1-1978, except for (1) the Health Physics Supervisor who shall meet or exceed the qualifications of Regulatory Guide 1.8., September 1975, and (2) the Shift Technical Advisor who shall have a bachelor degree or equivalent in a scientific or engineering discipline with specific training in plant design and plant operating characteristics, including transients and accidents.

6.4 TRAINING

6.4.1 A retraining and replacement training program for the unit staff shall be maintained under the direction of the Training Manager and shall meet or exceed the requirements and recommendations of Section 5.5 of ANSI/ANS-3.1 - 1978 and 10 CFR Part 55 and the supplemental requirements specified in Sections A and C of Enclosure 1 of the March 28, 1980 NRC letter to all licensees, and shall include familiarization with relevant industry operational experience.

6.5 REVIEW AND AUDIT

6.5.1 FACILITY REVIEW GROUP (FRG)

FUNCTION

6.5.1.1 The Facility Review Group shall function to advise the Plant General Manager on all matters related to nuclear safety.

COMPOSITION

6.5.1.2 The FRG shall have voting members composed of individuals from each of the following disciplines:

Operations	Electrical Maintenance
Reactor Engineering	Mechanical Maintenance
Health Physics	Technical Support
Chemistry	Quality Assurance/Control
Licensing	Services
Instrument and Control	

The Plant General Manager shall appoint the FRG members, in writing, and from this membership shall designate, in writing, an FRG Chairman.

Members shall meet or exceed the qualifications required for Managers, Supervisors, or Professional-Technical, as appropriate, pursuant to Specification 6.3.1.

6.3 UNIT STAFF QUALIFICATIONS (Continued)

shall meet or exceed the qualifications of Regulatory Guide 1.8, September 1975 and (2) the Shift Technical Advisor who shall have a bachelor's degree or equivalent in a scientific or engineering discipline with specific training in plant design and plant operating characteristics, including transients and accidents.

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ALTERNATES

6.5.1.3 All alternate members shall be appointed in writing by the FRG Chairman to serve on a temporary basis; however, no more than two alternates shall participate as voting members in FRG activities at any one time.
