STATE OF UTAH'S REQUEST TO THE COMMISSION FOR AN
OPPORTUNITY TO BRIEF THE LICENSING BOARD'S REFERRED
QUESTION TO THE COMMISSION IN LBP-01-37

On December 13, 2001 the Licensing Board ruled on the admissibility of Late-Filed Contention Utah RR, Suicide Mission Terrorism and Sabotage. LBP-01-37. For the most part the Board found that the contention met the late filed factors but the Board denied admission of the contention. The Board found that the question of the agency's NEPA responsibilities relating to a September 11, 2001-type event was "a close one." LBP-01-37, slip op at 13. The Board observed that things are not -- and may never be -- the same after September 11 and as the Commission currently is considering regulatory changes in the wake of that fateful day, it referred the matter to the Commission. Id. slip op at 14.

Another licensing board (the MOX Board) ruled in favor of admission of a NEPA contention relating to a September 11, 2001-type event. Duke Cogema Stone & Webster (Savannah River Mixed Oxide Fuel Fabrication Facility), LBP-01-35, 54 NRC ___, ___ (slip op. at 50-55) (Dec. 6, 2001). There is a direct conflict between the PFS and the MOX Licensing Boards. Moreover, the PFS Board's ruling raises the question of the application of
