This acknowledges your recent October 3, 2001 letter to our 9th District Legislative Office.

By way of this reply, our Delegation would like to reach out to convey to you our appreciation for your efforts as a citizen to contact our office to outline your strong concerns and serious allegations about the security forces at the Oyster Creek nuclear generating station.

First, we would like to assure you our Delegation responded immediately within minutes of the attack on the World Trade Center on September 11 to <u>strongly urge</u> Acting Governor DiFrancesco to exercise his authority to activate the National Guard to protect Oyster Creek and the state's other nuclear generating facilities. Further, our Delegation also recently introduced legislation to enhance the weaponry utilized by Oyster Creek's security personnel.

As you may be aware, the New Jersey State Police in cooperation with local police are now protecting the facility. The primary responsibility for security at all nuclear generating facilities falls within the jurisdiction of the Federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management. By copy of this reply, we are forwarding your statement to the NRC and Office of Emergency Management Director Captain Dennis Quinn, NJSP. This conveyance calls upon the NRC and Captain Quinn to review your serious allegations and concerns about security at the nuclear generating facility here at Ovster Creek. Mr. G. Oyster Creek's security is lax

As a former employee at the Oyster Creek nuclear power plant in Lacey, I was not surprised to learn that the contract security force was ineffective in preventing stimulated intrusions into the facility during an NRC sponsored drill. As a result, the plant security rating was downgraded from satisfactory to low moderate and the anxiety of the public was upgraded from the usual high to very intense.

When the Amergen Corp. purchased Oyster Creek in July 2000, it decided to lay off the existing in-house security force of highly trained, professional officers and replace them with contract guards whose qualifications many considered substandard to the proprietary force. While Amergen saved money on salaries and benefits, the health and safety of the public was not served.

To my knowledge, the plant security rating as never downgraded when the in-house force is protecting it. Maybe if an international terror t, Amergen plans to confront him with its profit-a..dloss statement.
