Gentlemen:

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 21 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-62 for the Brunswick Steam Electric Plant Unit No. 2. This amendment identifies the currently approved industrial security plan for Brunswick Steam Electric Plant, and incorporates the plan as a condition of the operating license. The past practice of issuing approval letters for revisions to the plan has been discontinued. Future changes will be identified by license amendment.

We have reviewed the industrial security plan for Brunswick, including Revision 4 forwarded by CP&L letters dated March 4 and July 19, 1976. Based on our review, we find that the security plan as modified by Revision 4 is consistent with Regulatory Guide 1.17, "Protection of Nuclear Power Plants Against Industrial Sabotage", and is acceptable. An evaluation finding has been placed in the Commission's files. Pursuant to 10 CFR §2790(d), this evaluation and the documents comprising the security plan are being withheld from public disclosure because they are deemed to contain commercial or financial information within the meaning of 10 CFR §9.5(a)(4) and subject to disclosure only in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR §9.12.

A copy of the Federal Register Notice is also enclosed.

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 21
License No. DPR-62

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The application for amendment by Carolina Power & Light Company (the licensee) dated March 4, 1976, as supplemented July 19, 1976, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

2. Accordingly, the license is amended by the addition of new paragraph 2.C.(6):

(6) Physical Security Plan

The licensee shall maintain in effect and fully implement all provisions of the NRC-approved physical security plan, including changes made pursuant to the authority of 10 CFR Section 50.54(p). The approved security plan consists of the original plan entitled 'Carolina Power & Light Company - Brunswick Steam Electric Plant - Industrial Security Plan' as revised and described in the following letters:

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY
OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 21 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-62, issued to Carolina Power & Light Company (the licensee) for operation of the Brunswick Steam Electric Plant, Unit No. 2 (the facility), located in Brunswick County, North Carolina. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance.

This amendment identifies and incorporates into the operating license the currently approved industrial security plan for the Brunswick Steam Electric Plant.

The application for amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant


to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement, negative declaration, or environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.

Pursuant to 10 CFR §2.790(d), the licensee's request for amendment dated March 4, 1976, with supplemental letter dated July 19, 1976, and the security plan are being withheld from public disclosure because they are deemed to be commercial or financial information within the meaning of 10 CFR §9.5(a)(4). The withheld information is subject to disclosure in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR §9.12.
