Please be informed that the bankruptcy filing does not relieve Kaiser of its obligations to comply with U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) requirements, including those relating to security and control of radioactive material; decontamination and decommissioning of contaminated facilities and land; and the retention of personnel required by NRC requirements. Additionally, inspections of your activities will continue to occur.

If the Radiation Safety Officer leaves your employ, you must first properly secure, dispose of, or transfer all licensable material, and you must inform NRC of this situation. You may not transfer licensable material except as authorized by NRC regulations or your approved Decommissioning Plan.
