Subject: Transfer of Active License Files to the
State of New York - Group I, and II

Dear Mr. Townsend:

Pursuant to the agreement between the AEC and the State of New York for discontinuance of certain Commission regulatory authority, I am transferring to you this date the license files pertaining to 305 Group I and 74 Group II AEC materials licenses. The licenses are listed in the enclosures attached. It is to be noted the enclosures do not include the listings of the material transferred to you on 10/10/62. The revised listing shows this group to consist of one Part 70 and 184 Part 30 Group I licenses, and 25 Part 30 Group II licenses.

These files include copies of AEC licenses, license amendments, license applications, correspondence between the licensee and AEC with respect to applications, licensing and enforcement matters and similar material of historical value (including superseded or terminated licenses) pertaining to the licensed programs, all of which have been maintained to date in the active files within Region I, Division of Compliance.

The material relates to AEC licenses issued pursuant to 10 CFR 30, 40 and 70. In preparing the files for transfer, it was found convenient to establish three groups or categories.

They are as follows:

Group I

Encompasses those active licenses which appear to be completely transferrable to the State pursuant to 10 CFR 150. The files that you receive for these licenses are comprised of the actual copies of file matters that have been maintained within our office.

Group II

Encompasses those active licenses which appear to be of the type in which both the AEC and New York will have a continuing interest for a period of time following the effective date of the agreement. We have prepared duplicate copies of file matters for you.

Group III

Those active licenses for which jurisdiction will remain solely with the AEC. Copies of these licenses have been and will continue to be furnished to your office.

With the exception of those pages furnished to you on 10/10/62, enclosed are copies of the inventory for Groups I, II, and III. The pages on the 10/10/62 inventory are numbered to fit into the numbering of the pages of the enclosed inventory.

As noted on the inventory sheets, the licenses listed under each of the groupings have been further broken down into separate sections and an explanation of each of the sections follows:

Group I

Section A: 644 Part 30 licenses

Section B: Expiring licenses transferred to you
on 10/10/62

Section C: 50 Part 30 Civil Defense licenses

Section D: 3 Waste Disposal licenses

Group I (Continued)

Section E: 7 licenses issued to companies outside the State of New York but authorizing use of material only within the State of New York.

Section F: 33 Part 40 (source) licenses

Section G: 37 Part 70 (special nuclear) licenses

Section H: 31 Part 30 distributor licenses

Group II

Section A: Expired Part 30 licenses involving use in other states and distributor of consumer products transferred to you on 10/10/62.

Section B: 44 licenses involving place of use in other states and questionable items

Section C: 12 licenses Part 30 distributor

Section D: 17 Part 40 (source) licenses involving place of use in other states, export or import incidental to other uses and distribution of consumer products.

Section E: Deleted

Section F: 1 Part 30 license issued to an out of state licensee but involving use in New York.

Group III

Section A: Federal Agencies (36 licenses)

Section B: Part 30 New York licensees use entirely in other states (25 licenses)

Section C: Export and Import solely (19 licenses)

Section D: Special Category (3 licenses)

Section E: Part 40 (9 licenses)

Section F: Part 70 (13 licenses)

Appearing in the list of Group II licenses there will also be some Group I licenses which have been included here for the sake of completeness. These licenses have been denoted by a star in the code column. It is to be noted that for the licenses falling in Group II A category, the state assumes jurisdiction of all operations within the State of New York, while jurisdiction for use of out of state operations will be retained by the AEC. A code sheet is attached to the Group II inventory enabling you to ascertain why specific licenses appear in this group.

The license files transferred to you are contained in nine boxes, the contents of which are labeled on the outside of each box.
