MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

On February 22, 2002, Intervenors Georgians Against Nuclear Energy (GANE) and the Blue Ridge Environmental Defense League filed a joint motion to postpone discovery pending submission by Duke Cogema Stone & Webster (DCS) of revisions to its Construction Authorization Request (CAR) and Environmental Report. The Intervenors' motion is based upon information revealed by DCS on February 13, 2002 at a public meeting with the NRC Staff. By letter dated February 14, 2002, the NRC Staff informed the Board of a number of matters from that meeting. Specifically, the Staff indicated that changes in the plans of DOE and DCS will necessitate the filing of a supplement to DCS's environmental report and a supplemental CAR. The Staff letter indicates that it anticipates providing within 30 days a new schedule for issuing the draft and final EIS. Finally, the Intervenors' motion, referencing DCS's viewgraphs from the meeting, states that DCS anticipates that the schedule for the issuance of the final EIS and final SER will slip by 11 months. Both DCS and the Staff oppose the Intervenors' motion.

The Intervenor's motion is granted in part. The discovery schedule contained in paragraph 10 of the Licensing Board's February 12, 2002 Memorandum and Order is hereby canceled and the Board will issue a revised discovery schedule upon reviewing the Staff's new schedule containing the Staff's latest review estimates. Further, both DCS and GANE have interlocutory review petitions pending before the Commission that may significantly alter the scope of the current proceeding and impact the amount of discovery conducted in the proceeding. Therefore, the Board will revisit the scheduling issue in 30 days by which time the Staff will have had time to adjust and publish its new projected schedule and the matters pending before the Commission may have been resolved.

It is so ORDERED.
