Dear Mr. Griffith:

This letter responds to your letters of October 29 and November 20, 2001, wherein you identify an historic property that you believe falls within the area of potential effects for the Peach Bottom Atomic Power Station (PBAPS) license renewal application now being reviewed by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Specifically, the property is the Chesapeake and Delaware feeder canal where it crosses the portion of the Keeney transmission line corridor which lies within the state of Delaware.

As defined by the Commission, the scope of the NRC staff's review of a license renewal application is limited. The process, however, does include a review of the impacts to historic and archeological resources. See 10 C.F.R. §51.53(c)(3)(ii)(K). Pursuant to that obligation, the NRC staff has reviewed the license renewal application. Also, in response to information provided by your staff (Ms. Faye Stocum), and your letter of October 29, 2001, the NRC staff and our consultants visited the site (November 8, 2001) and issued a formal Request for Additional Information (RAI) to Exelon Generation, LLC (November 26, 2001, Adams Accession Number ML013300623). Exelon replied by letter dated January 23, 2002 (ML020600194). The NRC staff, pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act, plans to discuss this issue in the draft environmental impact statement scheduled to be published in July 2002.

The NRC staff has determined that, for purposes of the National Historic Preservation Act, the impacts of license renewal on properties along the portion of the Keeney transmission line in Delaware are beyond the area of potential effects. The staff bases its finding on the fact that the Delaware portion of the transmission line is not owned, maintained or controlled by Exelon Generation Company LLC, the NRC licensee for operation of the PBAPS and applicant for renewal of the operating licenses.
