Dear Mr. Mathews:

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 43 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-43 for Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant. The amendment consists of changes to the Technical Specifications in response to your application transmitted by letter dated February 20, 1981.

This amendment modified Appendix B (Environmental) Technical Specifications to delete sections relating to the aquatic environment. These sections are 2.2.1 and 3.2.1/Chlorination of Circulating Water System, 2.2.2 and 3.2.2/Suspended and Dissolved Solids, 2.2.3 and 3.2.3/Treatment Chemicals, 4.11 Aquatic - Fish Impingement, ETS 4.2-2 De-icing Operation. These limits (and the related monitoring requirements) were included to protect the aquatic environment.

In their letter of February 20, 1981, the Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (the licensee) justified their request for deleting the referenced programs by submitting that water quality requirements are now under the jurisdiction of the State of Wisconsin NPDES permitting system. Further, the NRC staff has taken the position that water quality conditions in existing Appendix B Technical Specifications must be removed as a matter of law.

Accordingly, we concur in the deletion of these programs and will rely on the NPDES permitting system administered by the State of Wisconsin for regulation and protection of the aquatic environment. We have informed the State of Wisconsin by telephone, and they have no objections to these Environmental Technical Specification (ETS) deletions.

We have concluded that, since this is a ministerial action required as a matter of law, no environmental assessment need be prepared as a condition precedent to taking the action.

- I. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The application for amendment by Wisconsin Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power and Light Company and Madison Gas and Electric Company (the licensees) dated February 20, 1981, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public;
and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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
2. Accordingly, the license is amended by changes to the Technical Specifications as indicated in the attachment to this license amendment, and paragraph 2.C.(2) of Facility Operating License No. DPR-43 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(2) Technical Specifications

The Technical Specifications contained in Appendices A and B, as revised through Amendment No. 43, are hereby incorporated in the license. The licensee shall operate the facility in accordance with the Technical Specifications.

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 43 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-43, issued to Wisconsin Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power and Light Company, and Madison Gas and Electric Company (the licensees), which revised Technical Specifications for operation of the Kewaunee Nuclear Plant (the facility) located in Kewaunee, Wisconsin. The amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.

The amendment modified the Appendix B Environmental Technical Specifications to delete sections relating to the protection of the aquatic environment. The Commission will rely on the NPDES permitting system administered by the State of Wisconsin for regulation and protection of the aquatic environment.

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since this amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

The Commission has concluded that, since this is a ministerial action required as a matter of law, no environmental assessment need be prepared as a condition precedent to taking the action.


