The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 35 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-43 for Kewaunee Nuclear Power Plant. This amendment consists of changes to the Technical Specifications to remove the limitations on the temperature changes across the condenser and the maximum temperature of the discharged condenser cooling water, and the related monitoring requirements. This amendment is in partial response to your request dated February 20. 1981.

This amendment modifies the Appendix B (Environmental ) Technical Specifications to delete Sections 211, Environmental Protection Condition, Thermal, and Section 3.1, Monitoring Equipment, Thermal. These limits (and the related monitoring requirements) were included to protect the aquatic environment and were the same as the limits in Waste Permit #69-363 of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. On September 28, 1979, the Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) permit was issued for the KewauneePPlant. This permit does not contain any thermal restrictions on the discharge of condenser cooling water. The NRC will rely on the WPDES permit issued by the State of Wisconsin for protection of the aquatic environment.

We have concluded that, since this is a ministerial action required as a matter of law, no environmental assessment need be prepared as a condition precedent to taking the action.

The other changes requested by your February 20% 1981 letter are still under review and will be addressed at a later time.

This amendment does not involve significant new safety information of a type not considered by a previous Commission safety review of the facility. It does not involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of an accident, does not involve a significant decrease in a safety margin, and therefore does not involve a significant hazards consideration. also concluded that there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action.

#### AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 35 License No. DPR-43

- 1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
  - A. The application for amendment by Wisconsin Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power and Light Company and Madison Gas and Electric Company (the licensee) dated February 20, 1981, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
  - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
  - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
  - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

2. Accordingly, the license is amended by changes to the Technical Specifications as indicated in the attachment to this license amendment, and paragraph 2.C.(2) of Facility Operating License No. DPR-43 is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### (2) Technical Specifications

The Technical Specifications contained in Appendices A and B, as revised through Amendment No. 35, are hereby incorporated in the license. The licensee shall operate the facility in accordance with the Technical Specifications.

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY
OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued

Amendment No. 35 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-43, issued to Wisconsin

Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power and Light Company, and Madison

Gas and Electric Company (the licensees), which revised Technical Specifications

for operation of the Kewaunee Nuclear Plant (the facility) located in

Kewaunee, Wisconsin. The amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.

The amendment modifies the Appendix B (Environmental) Technical Specifications to delete Section 2.1 Environmental Protection, Thermal, and Section 3.1, Monitoring Equipment, Thermal, which contain limiting conditions for operation and related monitoring equipment for protection of the aquatic environment. The Commission will rely on Wisconsin National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Systems (WPDES) permit issued by the state of Wisconsin for protection of the aquatic environment

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I which, are set forth in the license amendment. Prior

public notice of this amendment was not required since this amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.
