1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:

- A. The application for amendment by Wisconsin Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power & Light Company and Madison Gas & Electric Company (the licensee) dated April 16, 1979, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
- B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;

The Technical Specifications contained in Appendices A and B, as revised through Amendment No. 30 , are hereby incorporated in the license. The licensee shall operate the facility in accordance with the Technical Specifications."

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

Introduction

By letter dated April 16, 1979, Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (the licensee) requested a change to the Kewaunee Technical Specifications. This change would extend the current monthly surveillance period for the turbine governor and steam stop valves (Table T.S. 4.1-3 item 10) up to two months at end of cycle by waiving the closure tests when boron concentration is less than 150 ppm.

Discussion

Operability of the turbine governor and stop valves is checked monthly to assure the capability to control turbine speed in case of an unexpected loss of load. Failure of these valves could result in a failure of the turbine rotor and damage due to resultant missiles.

For end of cycle operations, performance of the closure tests leads to operational problems. Power must be reduced to less than 30%, which makes it difficult to maintain the axial flux difference within Technical Specification limits. The low boron concentration also requires processing of large amounts of reactor coolant to overcome xenon peaking and to return to full power. The licensee has requested a waiver of the test for end of cycle operations only.

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Evaluation

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Steam admission to the turbine is controlled by two valves in series; (1) the governor valve and (2) the turbine stop valve. Turbine overspeed is controlled by three independent speed sensors. The primary overspeed control is provided by an electro-hydraulic system set to produce a trip at 103% of rated speed. Backup speed control is furnished by a mechanical overspeed mechanism set to trip at 111% of rated speed. The electro-hydraulic control system furnishes a secondary backup which produces a turbine trip at 111% + 10 R.P.M. This redundancy in both valves and controls provides reasonable assurance that turbine speed control will be maintained.

The operating history of these valves includes more than 60 reactor and turbine trips, more than 100 trip signals during pre-operational and startup testing, and more than 40 monthly tests since January 1974. In all instances, the turbine stop and governor valves have operated properly. This history of trouble-free performance provides added assurance of the dependability of these valves and the control systems. The proposed technical specification change will allow the closure tests to be waived only at end-of-cycle when boron concentration is less than 150 gpm. Based on expected boron letdown rates of at least 80 ppm/month, this allows no more than a two month extension. This change is similar to the temporary technical specification granted by Amendment No. 4, January 20, 1975, which extended the surveillance period at end-of-cycle by 59 days.

Based on the above, we consider the waiver of the governor and turbine stop valve closure tests at end-of-cycle when the boron concentration is less than 150 ppm to be acceptable.

Environmental Consideration

We have determined that the amendment does not authorize a **change** in effluent types or total amounts nor an increase in power level and will not result in any significant environmental impact. Having made this determination, we have further concluded that the amendment involves an action which is insignificant from the standpoint of **environmental** impact, and pursuant to 10 CFR S1.5(d)(4), that an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with the issuance of this amendment.

Conclusion

We have concluded, based on the considerations discussed above, that: (1) because the amendment does not involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of accidents previously considered and does not involve a significant decrease in a safety margin, the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration, (2) there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by operation in the proposed manner, and (3) such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations and the issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.


